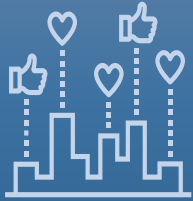

89% of IREx Institutional Profiles are complete (n=398!)

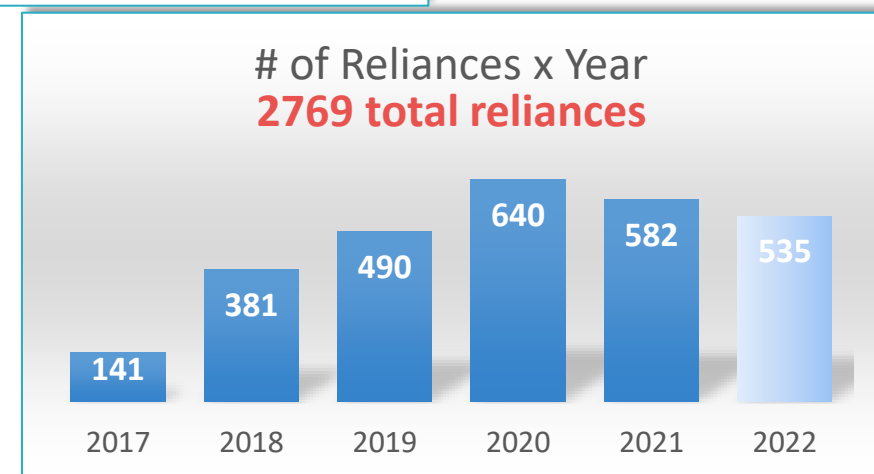
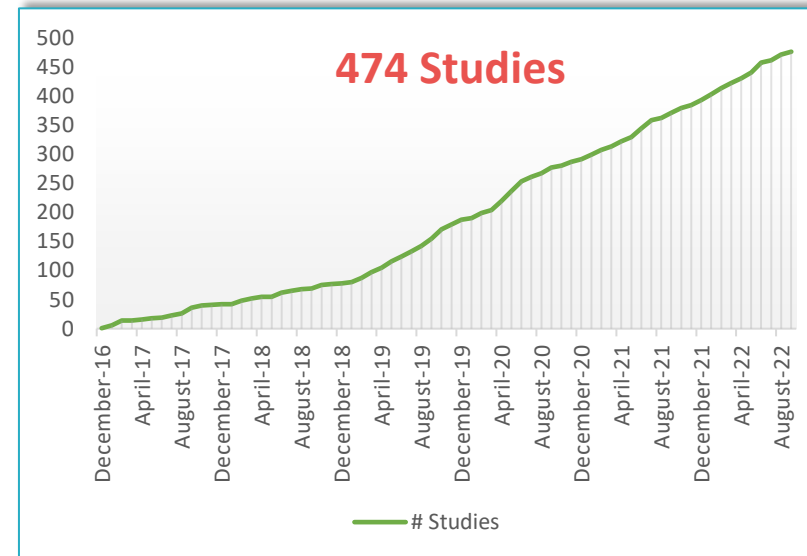


82% of IREx sites have indicated reliance on 1+ studies

Recent System Updates

Since January 2022

Automatically share approvals for Relying Sites (October 2022)

- Relying site approvals no longer have to be manually confirmed when there are not site-specific changes
 - At continuing review (e.g., ICFs aren't re-stamped or sites aren't enrolling)
 - For study-wide amendments that don't alter sites' documents
- New "Site Updates" tab to inform whether sites' can be automatically notified of approval:

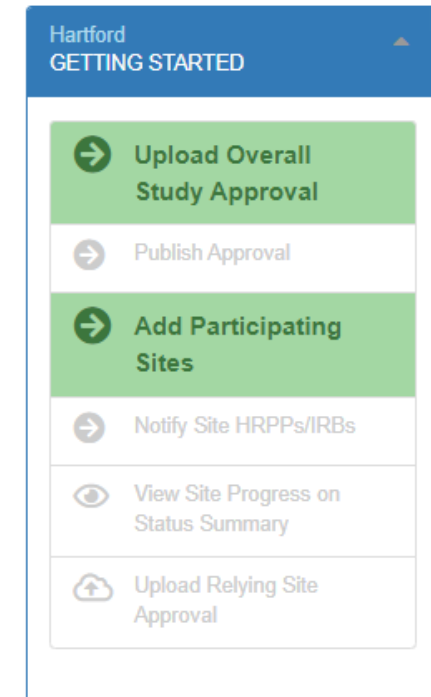

Study managers can now upload initial approval for the overall study/lead site (September 2022)

- **The sIRB now only needs to do the following IREx:**
 - Create the study
 - Complete the IREx Setup (agreements required, study & sIRB contacts)
 - Confirm the study-specific reliance plan (SSRP)
- **The lead study team/study manager can:**
 - Upload initial approval for the lead site
 - Add & notify participating sites (PSites)
 - Export local considerations
 - Upload approvals for PSites
 - Upload other study approvals (continuing review, amendments)



Simplified Local Considerations Workflow₊

(July 2022)

- **PSite Coordinators** have a Getting Started Checklist in IREx
- **PSite Coordinators** can complete the PI Survey
- **PSite Investigators** are only required to attest to the PI Survey
- **PSite HRPPs** no longer upload the locally-verified ICF to the HRP Survey
- **PSite HRPPs** are no longer required to validate the PI Survey



Complete IREx API for sIRBs



- POST: Study shell to IREx (title, sIRB, sponsor, etc)
- POST: Study initial approval for the lead site (risk categories, review dates, documents, etc.)
- GET: Relying site reliance information and local considerations
- POST: Relying site initial approval (review dates, documents, etc)
- POST: Additional study and site approvals (continuing review, amendments)
- POST: Site and study closures

GOALS

1. Minimize sIRB setup in IREx
2. Streamline ingesting of PSite local reviews
3. Streamline posting of approvals for the life of the study

- Bi-directional API between sIRB's electronic system and IREx
- System agnostic – can connect with any e-IRB system

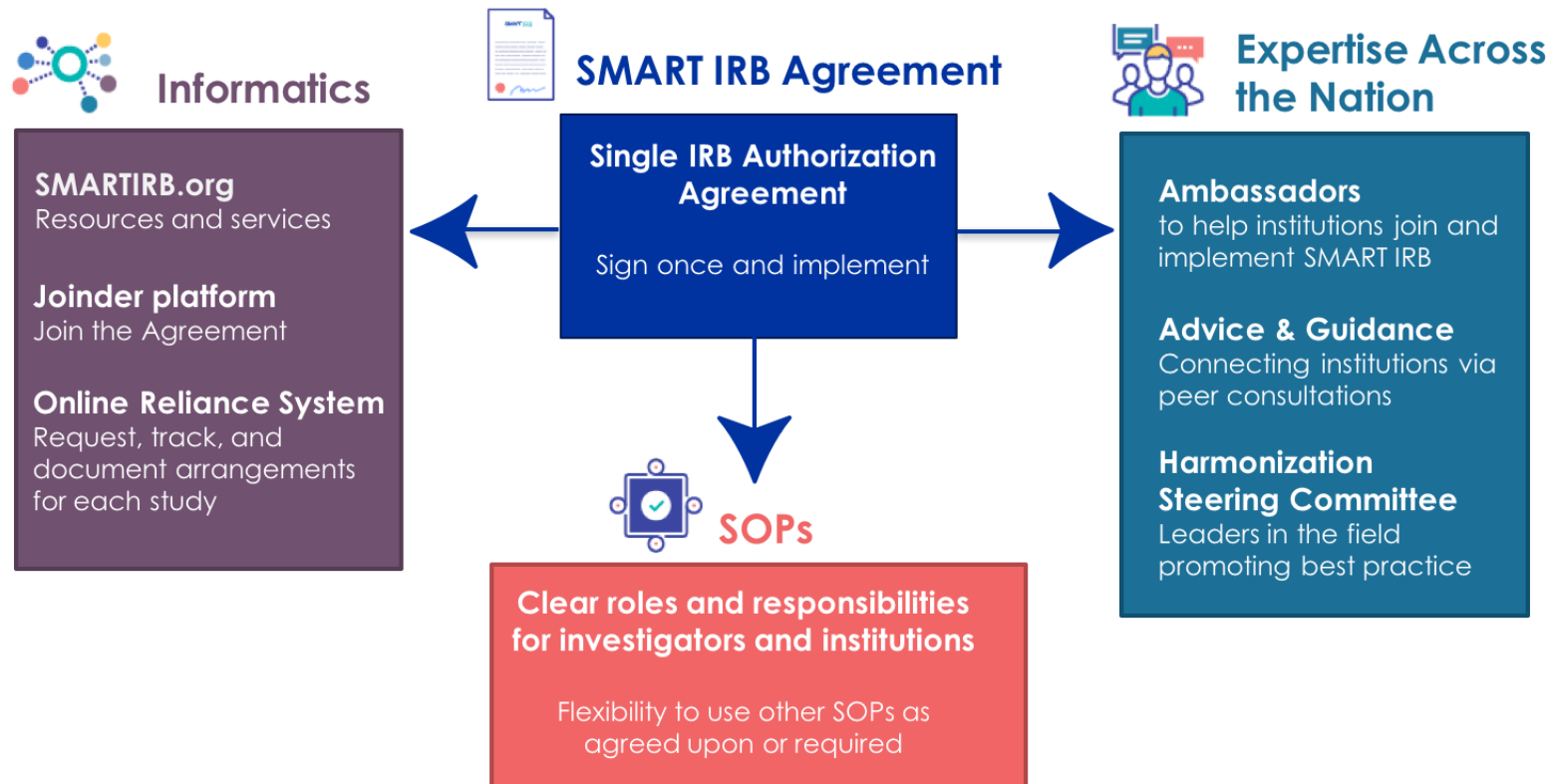

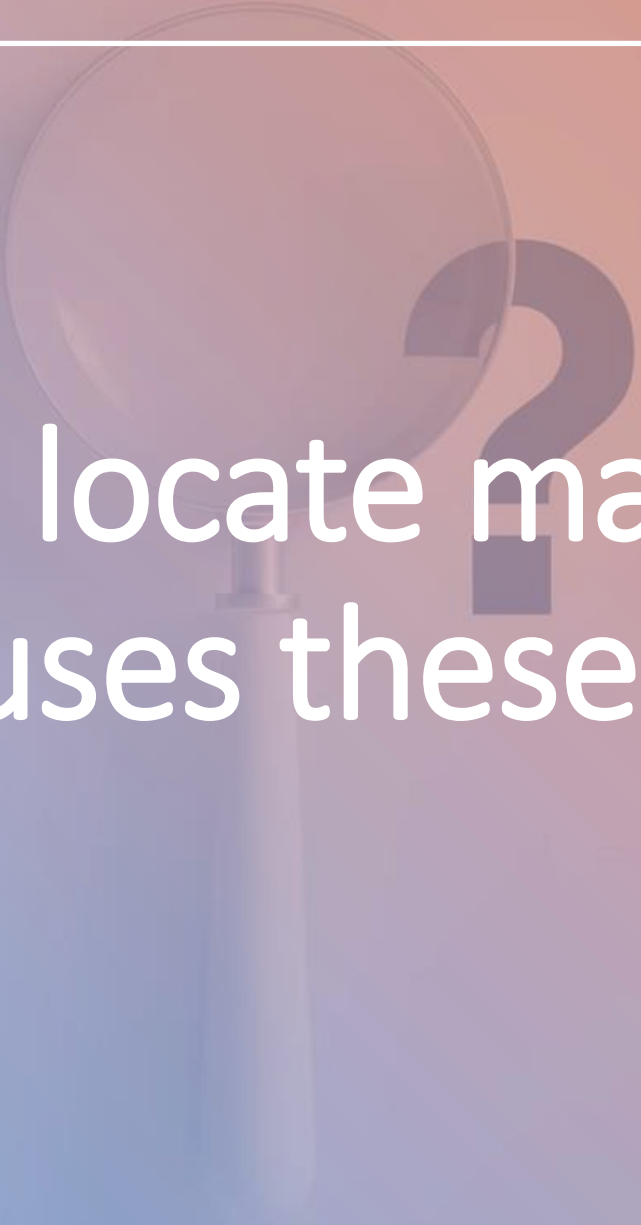

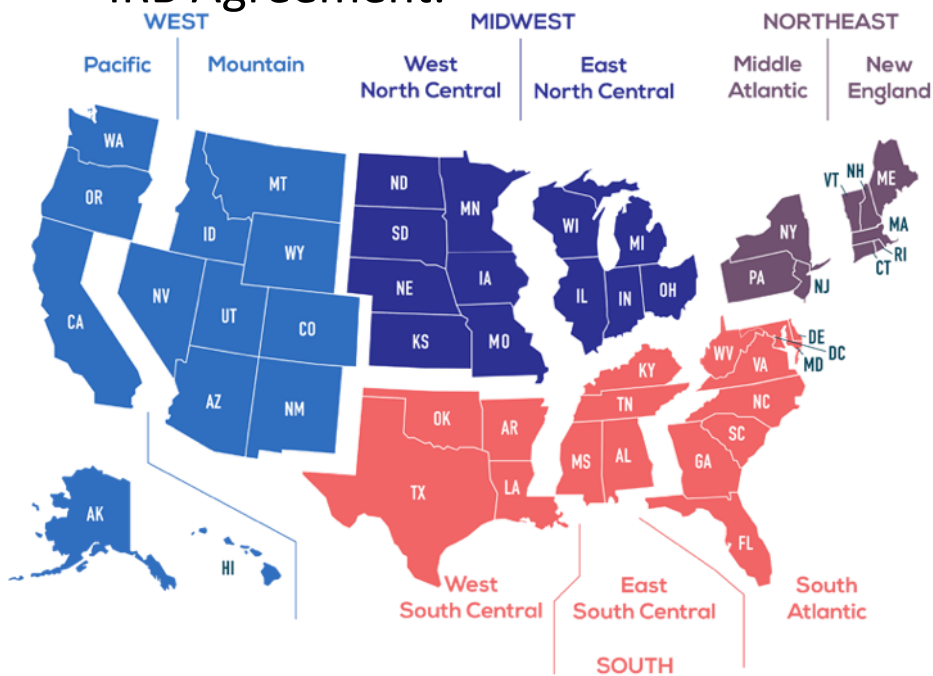

How do I get sites to sign the SMART IRB Agreement?

- Have sites review the Join Page and Join checklist. Sites can meet with a SMART IRB ambassador to discuss the sign on process and answer any questions.
 - IREx recommends sending the link to the SMART IRB Joinder page to sites while a) once a grant receives a score/indication of funding or b) the lead site is getting approved.

Why are not all SMART IRB member institutions members of IREx?

- The SMART IRB Agreement is the basis for reliance and is used broadly for document reliance, even if a study isn't using a web-based platform to document reliance or sIRB coordination.
 - Sites typically join IREx because they are on a study where the sIRB is using IREx. Unlike the reliance agreement, sites can join via a clickable Terms of Use (no major agreement to execute).

- No, but they are VERY similar, and both contain the basic, static information an SIRB might need to know about an institution with whom they're in a reliance relationship.
- They do not differ in substantive ways other than one being electronic and another PDF.
- IREx requires the Institutional Profile be completed to indicate reliance (per the guidance of the TIN SIRBs)
- IREx plans to align their Institutional Profile with the next iteration of the SMART IRB Institutional Profile (and local considerations documents) once released, under the guidance of the IREx User Feedback Group




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What are my options for documenting reliance on an sIRB?

- SMART IRB Online Reliance System (ORS)
- IRB Reliance Exchange (IREx)
- Email – using the SMART IRB Letter of Acknowledgement Template


NOTE: No system is required by regulation.







How do I know when to use the ORS vs IREx?

1. **The single IRB should communicate which system is being used for the study.**
2. **SMART IRB ORS may work well if another mechanism is in place to capture and share study related approvals and documents.**
3. **IREx may work well when the sIRB & lead study team need to a mechanism to capture and track site completion of local considerations and capture and notify sites of sIRB approvals.**




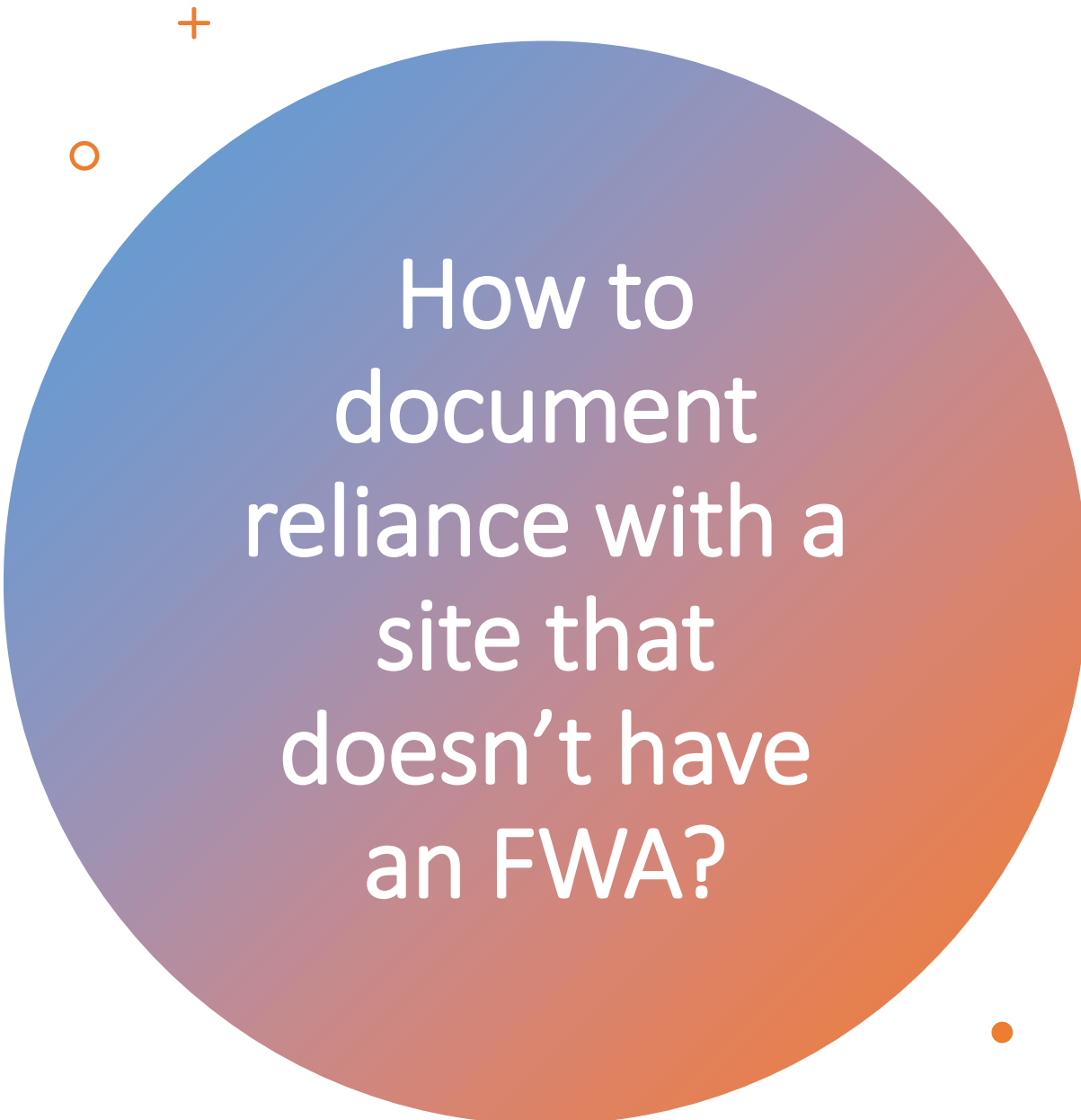
It's NOT RECOMMEND to use BOTH systems for the SAME study to avoid confusion from sites and extra work by the sIRB.





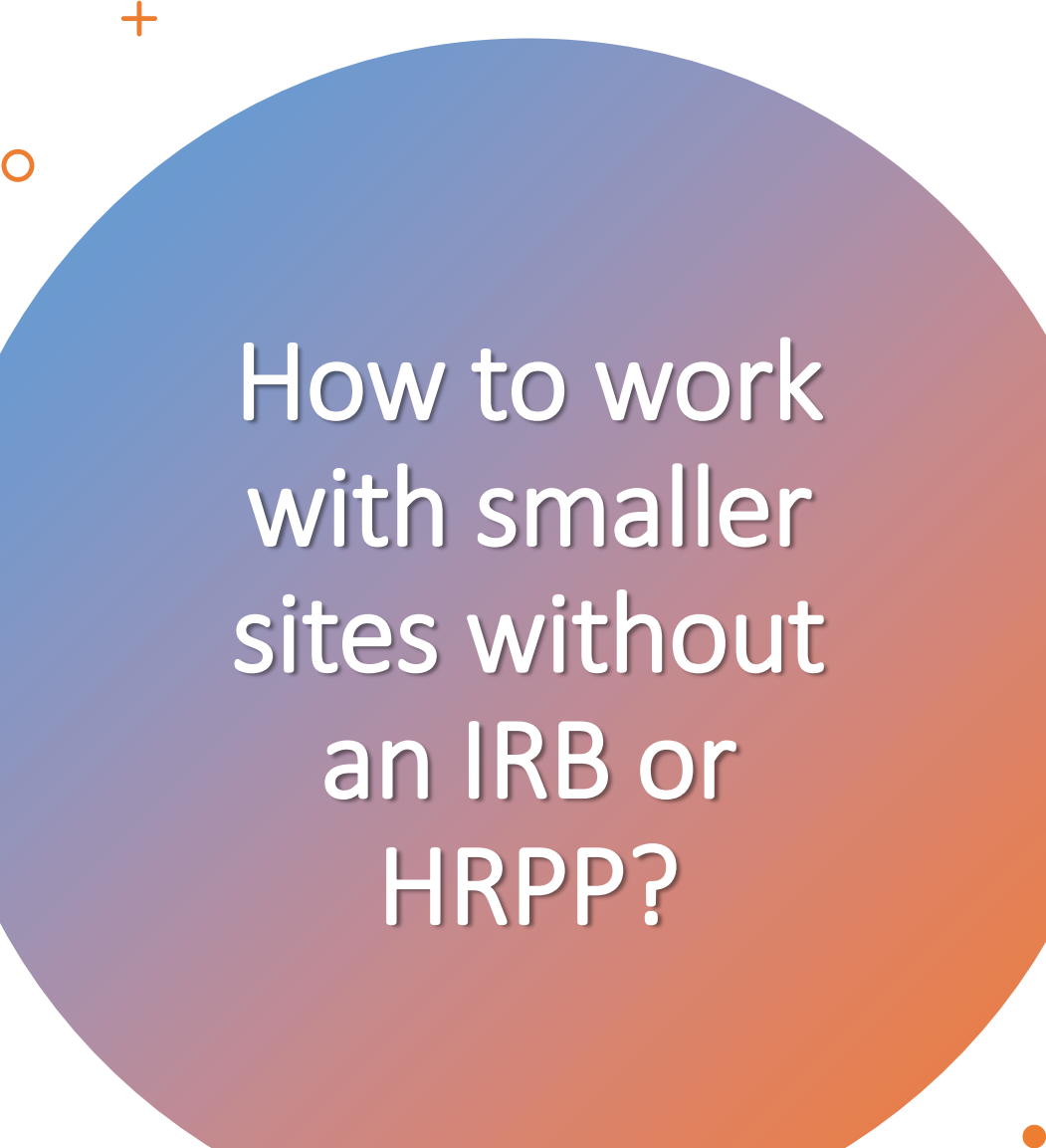
How to
document
reliance with a
site that is not
a member of
SMART IRB?

1. Ask the site to join SMART IRB – always ask. It's in their best interest 😊
 2. Use IREx to track one-off / study-specific reliance agreements with sites that cannot join SMART
 3. Document reliance via email

How to
document
reliance with a
site that
doesn't have
an FWA?

1. For most reliance arrangements the site needs to get an FWA. 😊
2. Individual Investigator Agreement can be used in limited instances.
3. Next the site needs to join SMART IRB (or a one-off agreement if they are prohibited from joining SMART)
4. Documenting reliance: ORS, IREx, Email



How to work with smaller sites without an IRB or HRPP?

- Use the SMART IRB Investigator Learning Center and resources to help train study teams.
 - IREx team typically connects site with sIRB for consultation and hand-holding to ensure sIRB has relationship & the information they need
